Grant funding is available for limited, one-time financial assistance to eligible small businesses and artists in Salt Lake City that were negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic or related shutdowns.



How Much Can I Apply For?

- Small Businesses, artists/artisans, and musicians can apply for grants up to \$50,000
- Nonprofits offering arts or small business- specific COVID-19 recovery programming can apply for grants up to \$100,000



Who Is Eligible to Apply?

Small businesses, home-based businesses, food trucks, artists and musicians are eligible to apply. Eligibility requirements to apply include, but are not limited to:

- Business is physically located and licensed to do business in Salt Lake City since January 1, 2020 (if you are a home-based business, artist or musician, a business license is not required)
- · Business has less than 50 full-time employees.
- Business can show it was negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic or related shutdowns.
- Nonprofit organizations are eligible if offering programming for arts or small business- specific COVID-19 recovery.



Eligible uses of grant funding

- Wages (payroll or benefits)
- Costs to retain employees
- · Mortgage, rent, or utilities costs
- COVID-19 prevention procedures (enhanced cleaning, barriers/dividers, COVID-19 vaccinations/testing)
- One-on-one business counseling, or other business planning services
- · Other operating costs



Requirements to Apply:

- Submit your completed application
- Submit Federal Income Tax Returns (pre- and post-pandemic)
- Submit your W-9
- Submit a current copy of your Salt Lake City Business License (unless you are a home-based business, artist or musician)
- Submit a Photo ID
- Additional documentation is required if you are a sole owner/proprietor, requesting funding for employee wages/ benefits, or received additional federal, state, or local COVID-19 financial assistance

How Much Funding is Available?

• \$2 million in grant funding is available for limited, one-time financial assistance to eligible small businesses and artists in Salt Lake City that were negatively impacted by the COVID-19 Pandemic or related shutdowns.

How Much Can I Apply For?

- Small Businesses, artists/artisans, and musicians can apply for grants up to \$50,000
- Small Businesses in the Travel, Tourism, and Hospitality Sector can apply for grants up to \$50,000
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- Business has less than 50 full-time employees.
- Business can show it was negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic or related shutdowns.
- Nonprofit organizations are eligible if offering programming for arts or small business- specific COVID-19 recovery.

Eligible uses of grant funding

- Wages (payroll or benefits)
- Costs to retain employees
- Mortgage, rent, or utilities costs
- COVID-19 prevention procedures (enhanced cleaning, barriers/dividers, COVID-19 vaccinations/testing)
- One-on-one business counseling, or other business planning services
- Other operating costs

Ineligible/prohibited uses of grant funding

- Deposits into pension funds
- Debt servicing
- Replenishing financial reserves (stabilization or "rainy day" funds)
- Other personal enrichment activities

Timeline for Use of Funds:

Grant funding may only be used for costs incurred after March 3, 2021. All funds must be spent by December 31, 2024, with receipts provided no later than December 31, 2026.

How do I apply?

The application portal will open for a 30-day window from September 1st to September 30th, 2022.

 During the application period, applications can be submitted online at www.slc.gov/ed, by mail, or in-person. Applications received online or in-person after the deadline will be considered late and will not be accepted.

Required Documents

In addition to the application, the following documentation will be required for grant consideration.

- Federal Income Tax Returns (pre and post-pandemic)
- W-9
- A current copy of your Salt Lake City Business License (if you are a home-based business, artist, or musician, a business license is NOT required)
- Photo ID

Additional documentation is required if you are a sole owner/proprietor, requesting funding for employee wages/benefits, or received additional federal, state, or local COVID-19 financial assistance

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Eligibility

My business already received funds from the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP), the Economic Injury Disaster Loan (EIDL), or a similar COVID-19 relief program. Can I apply for this grant?

Yes. However, businesses that have not received any prior funding from COVID-19 relief programs will receive weighted scoring during the evaluation process.

Is U.S. citizenship required to apply?

No.

My business is home-based or a mobile vendor (i.e. food truck). Can I apply for this grant?

Yes. Businesses that are home-based are encouraged to apply, as long as they reside in Salt Lake City. Mobile vendors (i.e. food trucks) are also encouraged to apply, as long as the business owner resides in Salt Lake City OR the business uses a commissary kitchen located in Salt Lake City.

Can nonprofits or religious organizations apply for this grant?

Yes, but organizations must offer programming that assists artists/artisans or small businesses with COVID-19 economic recovery. If you are a nonprofit or religious organization that offers social services or assistance, you might be eligible for a similar grant program being administered by Salt Lake City's Community & Neighborhoods Department. Application

What is the maximum grant amount my business can apply for?

- Small Businesses can apply for a grant up to \$50,000
- Small Businesses in the Travel, Tourism, and Hospitality Sector can apply for grants up to \$50,000
- Artist-Artisan Businesses can apply for grants up to \$50,000
- Nonprofits with arts or small business-related programming can apply for grants up to \$100,000

How long will I have to apply once the application portal opens?

Once the application portal opens, you will have 30 days to send in a completed application.

Several months later, there will be a second 30-day window where the application portal will be open. This second stage will allow for equitable access to funding to communities who may be engaged in one-on-one business assistance, need longer lead times to get through the application process, or were unsuccessful in the first stage and would like to apply again.

Are there translation/interpretation services for other languages available?

If applicants need assistance in languages other than English, our staff can work with the SLC Mayor's Office of Equity & Inclusion to coordinate translation & interpretation services.

Grant Awards

How will I be notified if I am awarded a grant?

You will receive an email from City staff notifying you if you have been awarded a grant and included in the email will be next steps for your business.

How long will it take for a successful applicant to receive an award?

Once your business completes several requirements outlined in the award email, the City will seek to release funds within 2 weeks, or create a budget for each approved applicant to request funds at a future date. If your business does not receive funding after 2 weeks, please contact City staff for assistance.

Does anything need to be repaid?

No, these grants do not need to be repaid.
