*WHEREAS*, the month of October is observed as National Blind Equality Achievement Month celebrating the history, advancement, and accomplishments of the organized blind movement; and

*WHEREAS*, throughout the month a variety of local outreach activities, many of which center around White Cane Awareness Day, celebrated on October 15, are offered to highlight and continue to bring awareness to National Blind Equality Achievement Month; and

**WHEREAS**, the white cane is a symbol of strength and independence amongst the blind community, as it demonstrates the ability to move freely and safely from place to place, making it possible for the blind to live the lives they want and fully participate in and contribute to our society; and

**WHEREAS**, Salt Lake City strives to be is an inclusive city progressing broader equity amongst all underserved populations, including the blind community, and will continue to seek education and insight from our SLC Accessibility and Disability Commission and the chapters of the National Federation of the Blind of Utah on how to better serve the needs of blind persons; and

**WHEREAS**, Salt Lake City recognizes the worth and productive capabilities of our blind citizens and will continue to facilitate the expansion of employment opportunities and greater acceptance of blind persons within the city's competitive labor market; and

**WHEREAS**, we call upon our educational institutions to offer full opportunities for training to blind persons; upon employers to utilize the available skills of competent blind persons and to open new opportunities for the blind in our rapidly changing society; and upon all citizens to recognize the white cane as a tool of independence for blind pedestrians in our neighborhoods and on our streets.
