BASIC OVERVIEW OF SLC FIRE HIRING PROCESS

We administer an entry-level testing process every two (2) years, on even calendar years, to establish a list of qualified entry-level firefighter (Firefighter I) candidates.

NEXT ENTRY-LEVEL FIREFIGHTER PROCESS BEGINS: January 2020

The process begins with an entry-level Written Exam. After the Written Exam, the top scoring candidates will be invited to the Oral Board Assessment (interview). Your Oral Board Assessment and Written Exam scores are combined to determine if you will receive an invitation to take the Candidate Physical Agility Test (CPAT). The CPAT assessment is pass or fail. Successful candidates will then be ranked, based on overall performance, and placed on a hiring list.

Between 2020 and 2022, candidates will be selected from the list for further testing and consideration, as jobs become available. If the initial list becomes exhausted more candidates will be invited to participate in the remainder of the process.







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Minimum hiring eligibility:

- Ability to legally work in the U.S.
- At least 18 years of age by the date of the Written Exam
- Possess a high school diploma or GED by date of the Oral Board Assessment
- Possess a valid driver's license by the time of employment

The application process for Firefighter I will go live January of the hiring year and will be available on our website via <u>jobs.slcfire.com</u>. Candidates must complete the application by the deadline in order to register for the Written Exam.

HIRING FREQUENTELY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQs)

Q: Do you need previous firefighting, Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), or Paramedic certification to be considered for employment?

A: We do not require previous firefighting, EMT, or Paramedic certification prior to general employment. Preference points may be awarded for previous certifications. Additionally, our department will cover the cost of basic EMT certification for Entry-Level Firefighters who do not possess a certificate at the time of hire.

Q: Does SLC Fire require a college degree to become a firefighter?

A: No, however a high school diploma or GED is required by the date of the Oral Board Assessment.

Q: Are there age, height, and weight requirements to be an SLC firefighter?

A: Interested candidates must be 18 years old by the date of the Written Exam. We do not have a minimum or maximum height or weight requirement. You do, however, have to be of sound mental and physical health. Visit_jobs.slcfire.com to learn more.

Q: What does a typical 48-hour set schedule look like at a SLC Fire station?

A: The primary responsibility of our crews is emergency response. In addition, a typical set schedule consists of equipment checks, vehicle maintenance, training, continuing education, physical fitness, community outreach, and public education.

Q: How many firefighters will be hired each year?

A: The number of firefighters hired each year fluctuates based on need, city growth and retirements.
