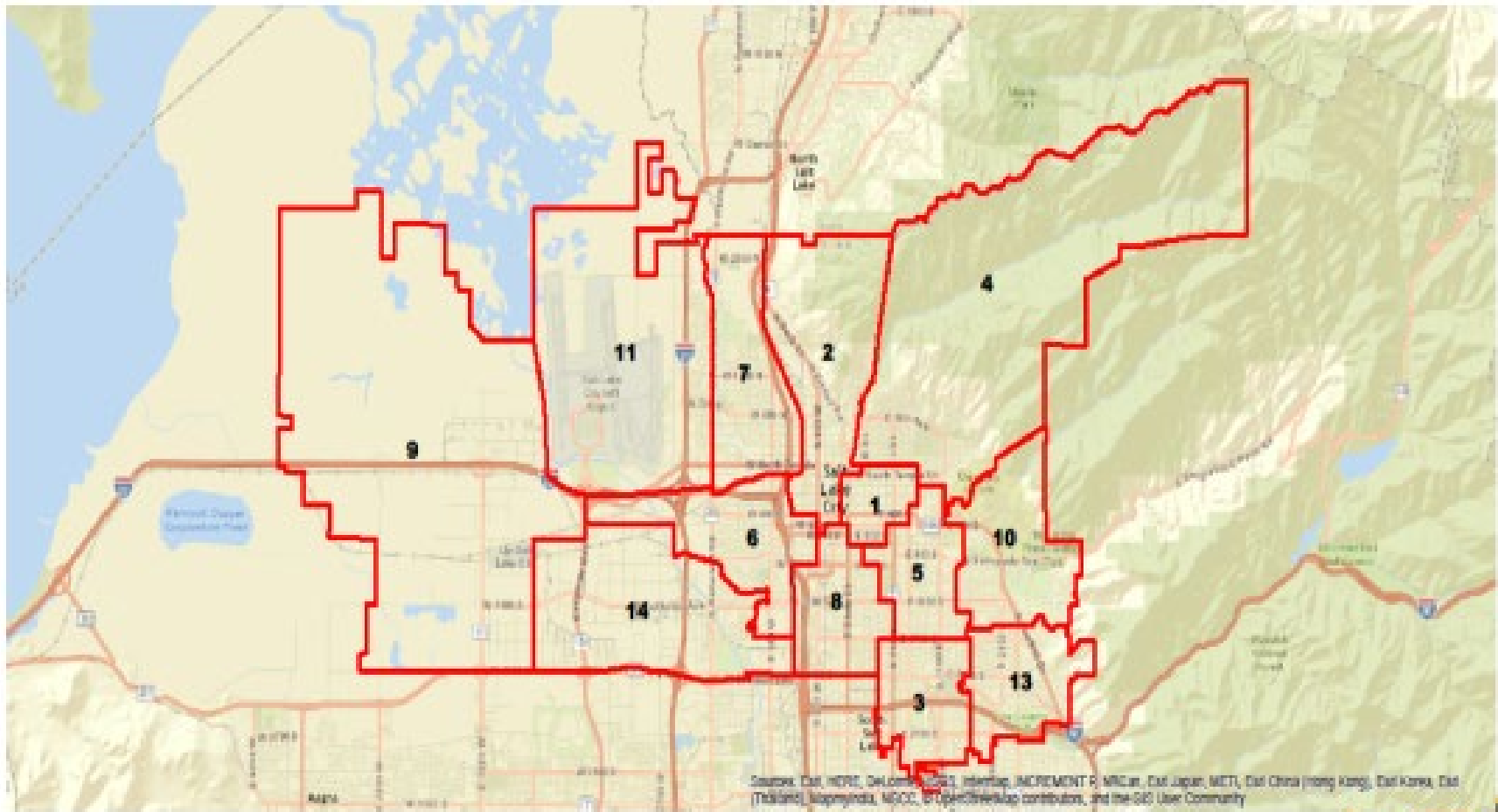

Salt Lake City Fire has 14 Fire Stations in SLC





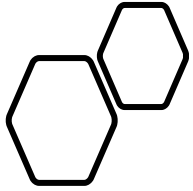

Captain Halvorsen and the crew of 7A serve at Station 7. Here the crew trains at the kitchen table.



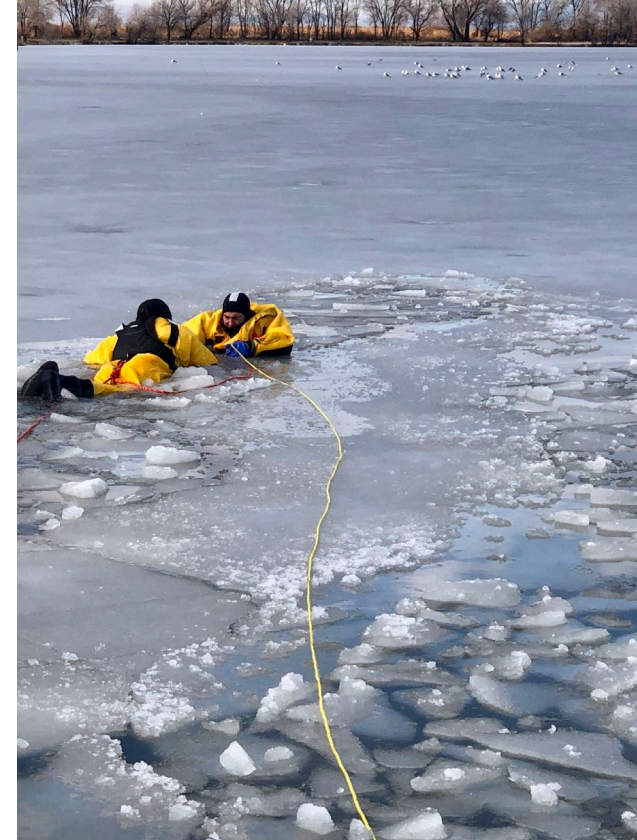
Firefighters sleep at the station house while on duty. Here is the hallway that leads to the bedrooms at Station 7.

Captain Halvorsen learning, educating and training. SLC Firefighters constantly expand their abilities to help the community.

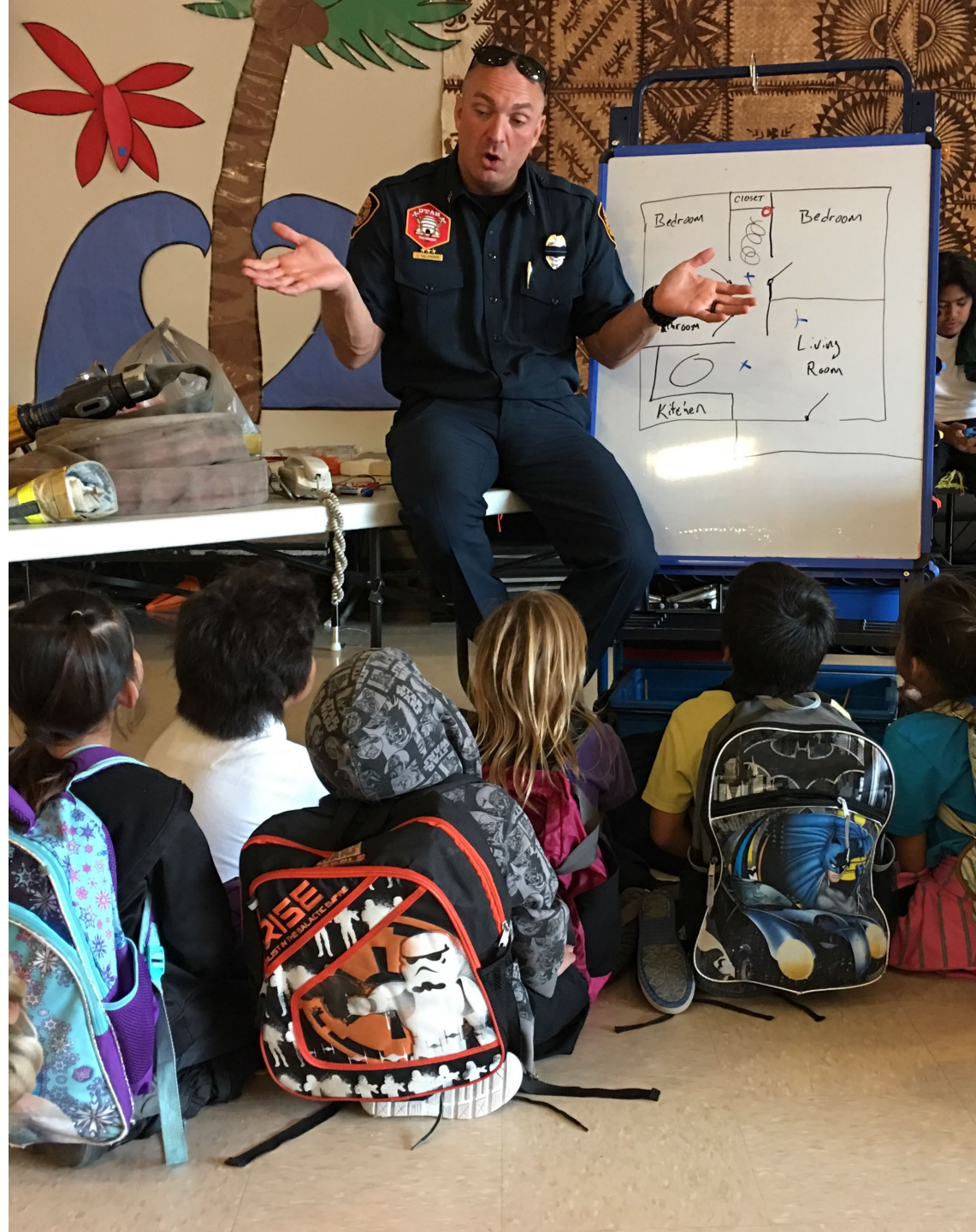


Crew 7A respond to calls large and small. They put out fires, they rescue ducklings.

Over 80% of 911 calls to which SLC Fire responds are for medical help. SLC Firefighters are EMT or paramedic trained to answer these calls.
