## **HOMEOWNERSHIP + HOME**

Thankfully they found out about the City's Welcome Home program, applied, and were approved for an income-qualified 3% low-interest loan. The Welcome Home program provides low-tomoderate-income families with the opportunity to become homeowners, as well as helps preserve our housing stock and eliminate substandard homes from our communities. In May 2018 Jared and Morgan moved into their new place in the Popular Grove neighborhood. They love their new neighbors, enjoying the many nearby parks and playgrounds, and being close to downtown.
