

## SALT LAKE CITY NOTICE FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT Salt Lake City is accepting public comments on a draft version of the City's Annual Action Plan for fiscal year 2021-2022**, for recommended projects and activities to be undertaken with federal funds under the following U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) programs:

- **Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)** CDBG funds may be used for the development of viable urban communities by providing decent housing and suitable living environments for persons of low and moderate-income.
- **Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG)** ESG funds may be used to assist individuals and families regain housing stability after experiencing a housing or homelessness crisis.
- **HOME Investment Partnership Program (HOME)** HOME funds may be used to create affordable housing opportunities for low-income households.
- Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) HOPWA funds may be used to provide housing assistance and related supportive services to persons living With HIV/AIDS and their families.
