A budget for families, residents, and our future

I presented my recommended budget for the 2025 Fiscal Year to the City Council on May 7. This budget delivers for families, residents, and our most vulnerable neighbors. The

\$475 million general fund budget addresses foundational needs for our City without any major tax increases. Some highlights include funding for:

- More affordable housing
- Street and sidewalk repairs
- Public art installations on the westside
- · Resources to address homelessness
- Public transit
- Parks and open space

SLC Public Utilities seeks feedback

Salt Lake City's Department of Public Utilities (SLCDPU) is seeking feedback from community members to inform the implementation of Salt Lake City's Street Lighting Master Plan.
