## The Elektron Solar Project

Residents and future generations of Salt Lakers depend on the City's unshakable commitment to sustainability. This week, I joined partners to celebrate the completion of the Elektron Solar Project, an 80-megawatt solar farm that will support Salt Lake City in achieving our goal of net 100% renewable electricity by 2030. This project brought many partners together, including Park City, Summit County, Utah Valley University, Deer Valley Resort, and Park City Mountain Resort. Salt Lake City is leading by example and showcasing what a renewable energy future can look like in Utah.

During the City Council's [formal meeting on June 11th](#), Smith Entertainment Group (SEG) presented more information about the proposal to create a Sports, Entertainment, Culture, and Convention District. 🚧 Reconstruction on 2100 South in Sugar House permits westbound-only traffic from 1100 E to 900 E; the eastbound traffic lane will be closed until about mid-August. [Click here](#) for more information or to sign up for project updates.
