Strengthening our relationship with Matsumoto

Earlier this month, a delegation of local leaders and I visited Matsumoto, Japan, Salt Lake City's first and oldest Sister City. Last year, leaders from Matsumoto came to our city for Pioneer Day and the 65th anniversary of our Sister City bond, so with more than a decade since a mayoral visit, it was time to return the honor. Since the late 1950s, we've shared a unique bond and many similarities—our populations are roughly the same, and even our mountains look alike. While Matsumoto and Salt Lake City have much in common, this trip gave me time to reflect on what truly sets our city apart.

Introducing the Tenant Resource Center

Every Salt Laker deserves access to stable, affordable housing, so I'm excited to announce our new **Tenant Resource Center and RAFT programs**, part of Salt Lake City's broader Thriving in Place plan.

- The **Tenant Resource Center**, staffed by Community Development Corporation of Utah (CDCU) navigators, is a one-stop service hub offering personalized assistance to renters. Navigators connect renters to various services, including eviction assistance, affordable housing resources, and support with basic needs like food and childcare. The **Center** will prioritize low-income households but is open to all Salt Lake City renters seeking support.
- The **RAFT program** will offer financial aid to displaced renters due to development or rent restriction expiration. Eligible renters can receive funds to help cover expenses such as deposits, first and last months' rent, and application fees, making relocation less financially disruptive.



Big news, travelers! The Salt Lake City International Airport just unveiled Phase 3, and it's a game-changer. The new River Tunnel connects Concourses A and B, shortening your walk and giving you a full sensory experience with its 100-song playlist (featuring music ranging from Post Malone to The Tabernacle Choir) to enjoy along the way.

We've also added five more gates and 12 new concessions that showcase the best of Salt Lake's dining and culture right inside the airport. That's not to mention the incredible new art, Gordon Huether's Canyon 2.0 and Northern Light, that brings Utah's natural beauty indoors. Oh, and one more surprise—the airport has a new friend over 150 million years old. I couldn't be more proud of the incredible teams that made this happen!



Utah Olympic and Paralympic athletes come home

I'm so proud of our Olympians and Paralympians from Utah who competed in Paris this summer! It was inspiring to meet amazing athletes like Sam Watson, a University of Utah student and world-record setting rock climber. (You should see the bling he brought home!)

With 34 athletes with ties to the Beehive State who competed in this summer's Olympic and Paralympic Games, Utah is proving we're not just a Winter Olympic state —we're a year-round powerhouse for worldclass athletes.
