My Recommendation for Chief of Police

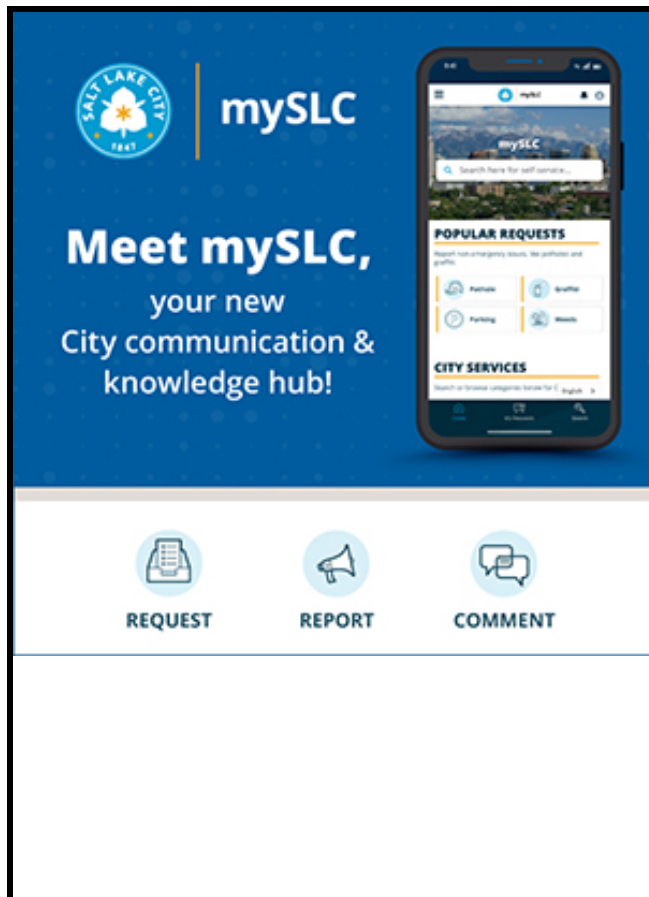
Salt Lake City is at a critical turning point for public safety, one that demands new leadership that can meet this moment with urgency and a proven track record of collaboration. [Last week, I named Brian Redd as my selection for Salt Lake City's next Chief of Police.](#)

Most recently, Redd served as the executive director of the Utah Department of Corrections. He also served for 21 years in the Utah Department of Public Safety, starting in patrol as a state trooper and ending as director for the State Bureau of Investigation in 2021.

He will appear before the [City Council](#) on March 4 for advice and consent.
