# FY2026 Budget Adopted

The City Council officially adopted Salt Lake City's Fiscal Year 2026 budget, which will go into effect on July 1.

Here are a few highlights I think you should know:

- Nearly \$4 million for public safety initiatives, to fulfill seven actions in our Public Safety Plan
- \$5 million for deeply affordable housing
- Launch of the **Clean City Team**, focused on improving North Temple and the Jordan River Trail conditions
- **Infrastructure upgrades** through the Capital Improvement Program (CIP), including trails, parks, restrooms, and streets—final project allocations to be made in August
- Vision Zero road safety improvements on Redwood Road, 900 West, and 800 South
- No property tax increase and modest utility, waste, and recycling rate adjustments to continue vital services

A new chapter in Salt Lake City's global story took flight with the inaugural nonstop service to Incheon, South Korea.

This new connection to Incheon, one of the world's busiest international hubs, is one of those steps. From Seoul, Salt Lake City travelers can now reach more than 50 cities across Asia. That kind of access is transformational. It strengthens our ability to welcome the world, deepen cultural ties, and create new opportunities for local businesses to thrive.

Not only is our Clean Air SLC program working, but it just hit a new milestone! With a record 1,434 applicants, this year's landscaping equipment exchange removed 4,000+ pounds of pollution, equal to taking 600 cars off the road. 73% of applicants recycled their old equipment.
