SLC DEWATERING NOTICE OF TERMINATION (NOT) ALL NECESSARY INFORMATION MUST BE PROVIDED ON THIS FORM

This Notice of Termination (*NOT*) for Discharges Associated with Dewatering Activities under the Salt Lake City (SLC) *Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4)* UPDES Permit *UTS000002* is for terminating all point source discharges (to the MS4, or Waters of the State) associated with dewatering activities identified under the coverage sections contained in the respective UPDES Dewatering General Permits for Construction Dewatering & Hydrostatic Testing (CDHT) (UTG070000) and/or Treated Ground Water (UTG790000).

Submission of this Notice of Termination (*NOT*) constitutes notice that the party(s) identified in Section II of this form are no longer authorized to discharge from dewatering activities under the *SLC City Discharge Permit*. If this termination is due to a change in operator/ownership of the facility, and the dewatering activity is to continue, this NOT obligates the permittee to coordinate with the new owner/operator (identified in Section II of this NOT) to gain appropriate City and State permit coverage before the facility is authorized to resume dewatering activities.

IV. CERTIFICATION (Permit Termination; Operational Control Release)

I certify under penalty of law that either: (a) all discharges associated with dewatering activity from the portion of the identified facility where I was an operator have ceased or have been eliminated or (b) I am no longer an operator at the facility and a new operator (identified in Section II of this NOT) has assumed operational control for those portions of the site where I previously had operational control. I understand that by submitting this notice of termination, I am no longer authorized to discharge to the MS4 (or Waters of the State) from dewatering activities under the UPDES dewatering general permit(s), and that discharging pollutants associated with dewatering activities to waters of the State is unlawful without this permit under the State of Utah Water Quality Act. I also understand that the submittal of this notice of termination does not release an operator from liability for any violations of this permit or the Water Quality Act.

V. VERIFICATION OF BALANCES PAID

All balances (fees, fines, penalties, etc.) must be paid to the City before submitting any Notices of Termination for a permitted facility. Failure to complete this verification and to pay all unpaid balances may result in additional inspections and subsequent costs-incurred which will be recovered from the owner/operator.



Instructions for Completing Notice of Termination (NOT) Form

Who Should File a *Notice of Termination (NOT)* Form?

Permittees who are presently covered under the SLC City Discharge Permit, as identified in Section II, should submit a *Notice of Termination (NOT)* form when their facilities no longer intend to continue discharges associated with dewatering activity as defined in the storm water regulations at UAC R317-8-3.9(b) (c) and (d), or when they are no longer the operator of those facilities.

SECTION I – PERMIT INFORMATION

Enter the existing Public Utilities (PUT) permit number assigned by the City to the facility identified in Section III. If you do not know the permit number, contact Salt Lake City Public Utilities Storm Water Division, 801-483-6700. Indicate your reason for submitting this *Notice of Termination (NOT)* by checking the appropriate box. If there has been a change of operator and you are no longer the operator of the facility or site identified in Section III, check the corresponding box and provide the new owner/operator ins Section II.

SECTION II – FACILITY OPERATOR INFORMATION

In this section give the legal name of the person, firm, public organization, or any other entity that has filed as an operator at the facility or site that desires to terminate coverage. The name of the operator may or may not be the same name as the facility and/or owner. If intending to transfer permit to new owner/operator, provide the new information here.

SECTION III – FACILITY /SITE LOCATION INFORMATION

Enter the facilities or site's official or legal name and complete address, including city, state, ZIP code, latitude and longitude of the facility (to the nearest 15 seconds of the approximate center of the site). It is preferred that the location address be the same as that which was used in the submission of the *NOI*.



SECTION IV - CERTIFICATION

State statutes provide for severe penalties for submitting false information on this application form. State regulations require this application to be signed as follows:

For a corporation: by a responsible corporate officer, which means: (i) president, secretary, treasurer, or vice-president of the corporation in charge of a principal business function, or any other person who performs similar policy or decision making functions, or (ii) the manager of one or more manufacturing, production, or operating facilities employing more than 250 persons or having gross annual sales or expenditures exceeding \$25 million (in second-quarter 1980 dollars), if authority to sign documents has been assigned or delegated to the manager in accordance with corporate procedures;

For a partnership or sole proprietorship: by a general partner or the proprietor, respectively; or

For a municipality, State, Federal, or other public facility: by either a principal executive officer or ranking elected official.
