1	Street Reconstruction 2027 This annual program funds reconstruction of deteriorated City streets, including pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalks, drainage, and appropriate walking, biking, and transit improvements.	\$8,327,500
4	Public Way Concrete This annual program addresses deteriorated or defective concrete street panels, sidewalks, accessibility ramps, curb and gutter, retaining walls, and other concrete in the public way.	\$750,000
6	Street Overlays This annual program funds shorter street segments focused on preventing deterioration that could otherwise require full reconstruction, including segments in livable-streets zones and along neighborhood byways.	\$3,300,000
17	Streets' Legal Compliance with 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design Funding will be used for curb-ramp and related right-of-way improvements needed to meet ADA requirements and improve safe, accessible movement between streets and sidewalks.	\$750,000
23	Highland Park Elementary Sidewalks Funding will add sidewalk and curb-and-gutter improvements along Kenwood Street and Atkin Avenue near Highland Park Elementary to improve a designated Safe Routes to School connection.	\$213,000

2	Sugar House Park Critical Infrastructure This is Salt Lake City's 50/50 funding match with Salt Lake County to replace the aging culinary waterline at Sugar House Park and reduce the risk of a critical system failure.	\$1,000,000
7	Safe, Open, and Clean Park Restrooms Funding will replace one failing City park restroom and upgrade the restroom at Riverside Park to improve safety, maintenance, and accessibility.	\$1,136,000
8	Jordan Park Sewer & Stormwater Infrastructure Improvements Funding will improve sewer and stormwater connections near Jordan Park's northern parking lot to address recurring backups, reduce maintenance burdens, and support safe park use.	\$300,000

20	Washington Park Septic Expansion Funding will expand Washington Park's septic system capacity to better serve current use and reduce frequent pumping and maintenance demands.	\$950,000
22	Parks' Legal Compliance with 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design Funding will improve arrival points, pedestrian routes, playground access and surfacing, and restroom access at up to seven parks to meet or exceed ADA standards.	\$811,000
31	Safe, Open, and Clean Park Restrooms Program (New Restroom) Funding will support the strategic installation of one new ADA-accessible park restroom designed to improve safety, maintenance, and usability.	\$568,000
34	Wasatch Hollow Dog Park Funding will support a fenced, approximately half-acre off-leash dog area at Wasatch Hollow Park to improve safety and usability for park visitors.	\$556,000
41	New Park Lighting to Improve Safety and Access Funding will strategically add lighting in parks to improve visibility and safety and extend use of sport fields and courts during darker months.	\$460,000
42	Glendale Park Sport Court Lighting Funding will install lighting at the popular pickleball and tennis courts at Glendale Park.	\$955,000
75	Glendale Park Phase 2 Mayor Added Project. Funding will advance Phase II improvements identified in the Glendale Park Vision Plan and provide project contingency as design work determines which amenities move forward.	\$6,000,000

12	Facilities Replacement and Renewal Plan Funding will address priority City facility assets that are beyond useful life, near failure, or no longer meeting operational needs to help keep buildings safe, code-compliant, and functional.	\$2,737,500
26	Public Safety Building EV Charging Expansion Funding will complete the final phase of EV charging infrastructure at the Public Safety Building by installing the remaining Level 2 chargers to support the City's expanding fleet.	\$80,000

3	GREENbike Rack Replacements This is the City's match for federal funding to replace aging GREENbike stations and worn, damaged, or missing bike racks and corrals.	\$65,000
5	Traffic Signal Replacement & Upgrades Funding will support replacement and upgrades of traffic signals in failing condition, including improvements to detection and communications equipment.	\$2,000,000
9	Vision Zero Corridors & Safety Improvements Funding will support targeted safety improvements on corridors with significant crash histories and selected locations citywide.	\$2,300,000
10	Urban Trails Funding will support priority urban trail and active-transportation connections, including trail design, rehabilitation, and construction of network gaps.	\$450,000
13	Traffic Signal Capital Maintenance Funding will support lifecycle replacement of traffic-signal components and pedestrian facilities to reduce reactive maintenance and improve safety, mobility, and accessibility.	\$500,000

24	1700 South Neighborhood Byway Crossings Funding will improve neighborhood-byway crossings along 1700 South from 200 East to 1200 East using treatments that can shorten crossings, improve visibility, and provide pedestrian and bicycle refuge.	\$263,000
27	Rose Park Safe Routes to School Crossing Safety Improvements Funding will support permanent crossing-safety improvements near Rose Park Elementary, including enhanced crossings and traffic-control treatments along key school routes.	\$362,000
76	Bike Racks Mayor Added Project. Funding will purchase and install new bicycle racks citywide, with a focus near local businesses in high-demand areas. Funds will not be used for renewal or replacement.	\$50,000
