JOINT RESOLUTION DECLARING NOVEMBER 2021 NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH IN SALT LAKE CITY



WHEREAS, *we strive to improve communications with, services to, and partnership with all City residents as we journey together on a quest for justice, equality, respect and prosperity.*


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED

that the Salt Lake City Council and Mayor of Salt Lake City declare the month of November 2021 as Native American Heritage Month.




