

Mission 1: Know Your Area



A wildland fire can happen anywhere there are plants living outside. That includes a forest, grasslands, or even a swamp.

Draw a picture of what the outdoors looks like where you live.




Mission 4: Get *Set*






Mission 2: Get to Know Your Firefighter
