### **Smoother, Safer Streets**

Salt Lake City has officially completed more than 100 road and infrastructure projects citywide, rebuilding 122 miles of worn-out streets and resurfacing over 300 lane miles of pavement. This is thanks to the voter-approved streets bond.

These investments are already paying off: nearly one-third of the City's worst roads have been fully reconstructed, more than half of all streets now rank in good, satisfactory, or fair condition, and coordinated utility upgrades mean many of these roads won't need major work again for many years!



### Glendale Park is Open

Phase one of Glendale Park opened this month—a milestone shaped directly by community input. The first seven acres of this 20-acre site include an all-abilities playground, a full basketball court, looping walking paths, shaded seating, open lawn space, a food-truck promenade, parking for accessibility, and a newly planted native wetland that supports biodiversity and stormwater management.
