Overview



As part of the *Funding Our Future* bond, Salt Lake City will reconstruct 200 South from 400 West to 900 East starting in 2022, with aspirations to create an iconic corridor where businesses thrive, residents feel comfortable and safe walking, transit users navigate easily, and visitors build lasting memories.

In addition to the corridor itself, the study is looking into options for a multi-modal transit center to serve as a focal point where different modes of travel - walking, biking, transit, and shared mobility - seamlessly converge.

The Transit Master Plan, adopted in 2017, was an intensive process that closely evaluated how to make transit work better for people living and working in the City. Fundamentally we understand that as we grow, it's important to provide choices in travel and reduce dependence on automobiles. We know that if done well, there are a lot of positive implications like public health, air quality, economic competitiveness, and quality of life. Of the 15 corridors evaluated, the Transit Master Plan recommended analysis of capital improvements on four east-west corridors, with the #1 recommendation being 200 South from Salt Lake Central to the University of Utah.

Better Transit Service and Improved Street Conditions were identified as two of the City's four critical needs through the Funding our Future bond, in addition to housing and safety priorities. Because the pavement on 200 South has reached the end of its useful life, it is included in the Funding Our Future initiative. We are taking the first steps to fulfill this voter-approved mandate by rebuilding 200 South and implementing the Transit Master Plan. We are also incorporating aspects of other adopted plans and policies resulting from years of discussion and public input, like the Complete Streets Ordinance and Climate Action Plan, Downtown Plan, etc.
