Project Benefits

- Community gardens and orchards are public spaces which encourage residents to share resources and become more involved in their neighborhood. This type of ongoing social interaction cultivates safer and healthier neighborhoods and improves the overall function and usability of the 9Line Trail.
- Fruit trees are a part of the larger urban forest, which, provides many benefits to the city, including microclimate control, storm water management, air filtration, water and soil quality improvement, and carbon storage.

Project Scope

The 9Line Community Orchard project will create an urban orchard that will be planted on small .70 acre vacant public property located along the 9Line corridor at 1100 West.

The project will include, grading, site and soil preparation, installation of drip irrigation for improved watering efficiency, planting of fruit trees, general site landscaping and park amenities.

The project will establish a strong partnership between SLC Trails and Natural Lands, SLC Urban Forestry, Tree Utah and Glendale and Poplar Grove Community Councils to create a community amenity to help activate the 9Line Trail Corridor.
