Rocky Mountain Power Wildfire Mitigation Project

Rocky Mountain Power (RMP) started Phase 3 of their <u>Wildfire Mitigation Project</u> in the Foothills Natural Area this month. RMP will conduct its construction work within their utility easements.

This will cause trail closures and detours in the Upper Avenues between East City Creek and Perry's Hollow. Impacted trails will include: the **Bonneville Shoreline**Trail (BST), Meadow Trail, 19th Ave bike trail, Avenues Ridge hiking trail,

Terrace Hills access trails, Kay Rees trail, I Street Bike Park, and 18th Avenue

Trailhead.



- Estimated project timeline for Phase 3: September 16 -December 10.
- Schedule: Active work will occur Mon-Fri 7am-6pm. Some areas will be closed after work hours for user safety as these areas are active construction sites.
- Notifications: Significant signage outlining project information and trail alerts have been installed at trailheads and on trails.

What's Blooming in the Foothills? Late Summer Wildflowers




Wildflowers aren't just for spring and summer! You can still find colorful blooms throughout the Foothills.

Where am I? Improving Trail Signage



The Foothills are home to hundreds of signs. These important markers provide information about trail usage to keep visitors safe and informed.

Trail usage: biking, hiking, or both
Trail direction: uphill, downhill, or both
Trail name and emergency locator
number

Destinations: distances to the next junction and popular destinations

This season we are updating wayfinding stickers like the ones pictured above and are adding welcome stations to many trail access points. Trailhead welcome stations will also have maps, dog waste bag dispensers, waste bins, and Salt Lake City ordinance info so you can Be W.I.L.D. while recreating in the Foothills!
