Our community would benefit immensely from better, safer, and more equitable connections to the east side of our city. The east-west connections in the city right now are lacking and - due to safety, time, family constraints, and more - nearly impossible unless a person has access to a vehicle (which is often a constraint itself for our neighborhood). Any expansion of the east-west connections would be helpful to our community members and businesses, especially connections that prioritize active transportation - walking, biking, and public transit. Not only could this benefit physical and mental health by spending more time outdoors, being active, better access to east-west active transportation connections could also have a substantial impact on air quality - which is significantly worse on the west side of the city. Our community would appreciate better connection and transit options to help break down the historical east/west divide in our city, and make our transit options safer.

I support Salt Lake City's grant application to the federal RAISE program to conduct a comprehensive planning project to make improvements to multiple east-west crossings between 600 North and 2100 South. This work will improve our community.
